ACCESS TO THE BEACH

The beach is accessible to visitors this summer. The works will continue, however. They will take place in two separate phases. Scan the QR code in order to see what phase the works are currently in, or visit the website: www.kustwerkkatwijk.nl.



All yellow paths and beach access paths are open. Some beach access paths are temporarily only accessible via an elevated pedestrian bridge. These bridges are marked on the map.

There are four bridges in phase 1 and 2. The bridge level with Voorstraat (pink) will be moved further south in phase 2. This bridge (blue) will then be located between Voorstraat and Andreasplein.

ACCESS FOR DISABLED PERSONS

The four temporary bridges are not suitable for disabled persons or pushchairs. Disabled persons and people with pushchairs can access the beach in the following ways:

- > Via the permanent access paths at the Noorderstrand (North Beach) and the Zuiderstrand (South Beach).
- > Via the southern service road. This starts at the access path opposite the Vuurbaak (lighthouse) / het Zeepaviljoen and runs behind the cafés along the beach.
- > For the cafés along the northern boulevard (level with the temporary bridges) it is possible to deliver and collect disabled persons in consultation with the café owners.
- > At the weekend and after 5.00 p.m. when there is no works traffic, level access paths are open in two locations immediately beside the bridges. These access paths are accessible for disabled people. The access paths are located beside the most northerly bridge and next to the third bridge, counting from the north end.

PARKING

Visitors to the beach can park their car in the existing car parks at Noordduinen, Zuidduinen, along the Boulevard and in the temporary parking spaces by De Zwaan restaurant. The bicycle parking facilities are unchanged. There is limited space for parking bicycles along the Boulevard and the beach access paths.

WHAT DO THE FLAGS ON THE BEACH MEAN?

QUESTION MARK FLAG

A lost child is waiting at the lifeguards station to be reunited with its parents.

YELLOW FLAG

Swimming is dangerous; do not take airbeds, inflatable boats etc. into the sea. With an offshore wind you could float out to sea and possibly be unable to get back unassisted.

RED FLAG

Swimming is prohibited. The red and yellow flags are flown when there is an offshore wind (wind from the land), a strong current or dangerous surf and stormy winds.

BLACK AND WHITE CHEQUERED FLAG

Marks an area from which vessels sail and are transported from the beach to the sea and back. For your own safety you are not permitted to swim in these areas.

DOGS / HORSES / FISHING

Horses, dogs and fishing are not permitted on the beach when this flag is flying.
